Comments from Bruce (Oct 2008)

He re-wooded my clogs, originally made by Crawshaw, a couple of years ago (c.2006). I think he made a very good job of them, as he pared down the new sole blanks to approximate much more closely to the original "duck-toed" shape than they had been as roughed out by the manufacturers. I was also impressed by his approach - he was keen to get them just as I wanted them, and took some trouble to ensure that I was satisfied with the fit.

At the time, he was just starting off in clog-making. He has over 40 years experience as a master carpenter, and has taught woodworking in technical college. His day job at that time was as a contract kitchen fitter. He'd been a non-dancing member/associate of Rumworth for some years (carrying kit etc on tours) so he has an interest in the NW morris. When Sandra Turton decided to give up clogging and go back to hairdressing, he took over her business, buying most of her equipment, with the exception of the heavy-duty sewing machine, etc., for making uppers. So at the time he wasn't making complete clogs, but was expecting quite soon to get hold of equipment to make uppers, and offer a full service. I was put in touch with him by Norman & Denise Bearon.
